

Cookie Policy

ULVAC, Inc. and each of its group companies including Physical Electronics, USA and ULVAC GmbH (hereinafter referred to as “we / us / our”), as a whole, use “cookies” or other tracking technologies to enhance your online experience. We use cookies or other tracking technologies in relation to your use of our website, our web server can, for example, track and record information about which pages in our website your computer visits, and we can improve or customize the products, content, offering or services on our website.

What are Cookies?

Cookies are small text files containing a string of characters that can be placed on your computer or mobile device that uniquely identify your browser or device.

Cookies allow a website or services to know if your computer or device has visited that the website or service before. Cookies can then be used to help understand how the website or service is being used, help you navigate between pages efficiently, help remember your preferences, and generally improve your browsing experience. Cookies can also help ensure marketing you see online is more relevant to you and your interests.

What types of cookies do we use?

There are generally four (4) categories of cookies: “Necessary cookies,” “Preferences cookies,” “Statistics cookies,” and “Marketing cookies.” We use all four (4) categories of cookies on our website. You can find out more about each cookie category below.

- Necessary cookies:
Are essential in order to enable you to move around the website and use its features, etc.
- Preferences cookies:
Enable a website to save information which has already been entered (e.g., user names, languages choices, and your location), so that it can offer you improved and more personalized functions.
- Statistics cookies:
Gather information about how a website is used (e.g., which pages a visitor opens most often, and whether the user receives error message from some pages).
- Marketing cookies:
Are used to deliver adverts and other communications more relevant to you and your interests. They are also used to limit the number of times you see an advertisement and to help measure the effectiveness of advertising campaigns, etc.

We may use cookies or other tracking technologies to manage and measure the performance of advertisements displayed on other websites you are visiting. By visiting our websites, whether as a registered user or otherwise, you acknowledge, and agree that you are giving us your consent to track your activities and your use of the services and functionalities through the technologies described above, as well as similar technologies developed in the future.

Cookies are small text files that can be used by websites to make a user's experience more efficient. The law states that we can store cookies on your computer or device if they are strictly necessary for the operation of this site. For all other types of cookies we need your permission. This site uses different types of cookies. Some cookies are placed by third party services that appear on our pages. You can at any time change or withdraw your consent from the Cookie Declaration on our website. How long will cookies stay on my computer or device?

Our website uses single-session (temporary) and multi-session (persistent) cookies. Temporary cookies last only as long as your web browser is open, and are used for technical purposes such as enabling better navigation on our website. Once you close your browser, the cookie disappears. Persistent cookies are stored on your computer for longer periods and are used for purposes including tracking the number of unique visitors to our site and information such as the number of views a page gets, how much time a user spends on a page, and other pertinent web statistics. Cookies, by themselves, will not be used to disclose your individual identity. This information identifies your browser to our servers when you visit the website.

First and third party cookies

First-party cookies are cookies that belong to us. Third-party cookies are cookies that another party places on your computer or device through our website. Third-party cookies may be placed on your computer or device by someone providing a service for us, for example to help us understand how our website is being used.

Third parties may also set and access their own tracking technologies when you visit our websites and they may have access to information about you and your online activities over time and across different websites or applications when you use our websites. Their use of such tracking technologies is not in our control and is subject to their own privacy policies.

How to control and delete cookies

Most web browsers are set up to accept cookies. You may be able to set your browser to warn you before accepting certain cookies or to refuse certain cookies. However, if you disable the use of cookies in your web browser, some services and functionalities of our websites may be difficult to use or may not function correctly, and you may have to manually adjust some preferences every time you visit our website.
